Godly Play

Developed in the United States by Dr. Jerome Berryman as a method of Christian education and spiritual nurture for children aged 2-12.

It has a creative and imaginative approach to telling Bible stories or presenting parables or lessons about traditions, using symbols and objects as well as words.

It invites listeners into the stories and encourages them to connect the stories with personal experience.

The goal is to teach the art of using religious language – parable, sacred story, silence and liturgical action – to enable meaningful participation in worship.

Godly Play is now being used with a wide range of age groups in a variety of settings – schools, hospitals, care homes for the elderly.

Language...

Open, economic but with Biblical truth Simple but not simplistic Child like but not childish

Silence...

Powerful

Pauses allow time to take the words in/ process what's been said

Wondering questions...

A way of reflecting and responding to a story

I wonder... what you like best about this story?

... which is the most important part?

...where you are in this story?

A child's version of the spiritual practice of lectio divina...

Encourages movement into larger dimensions of belief and faith.
